

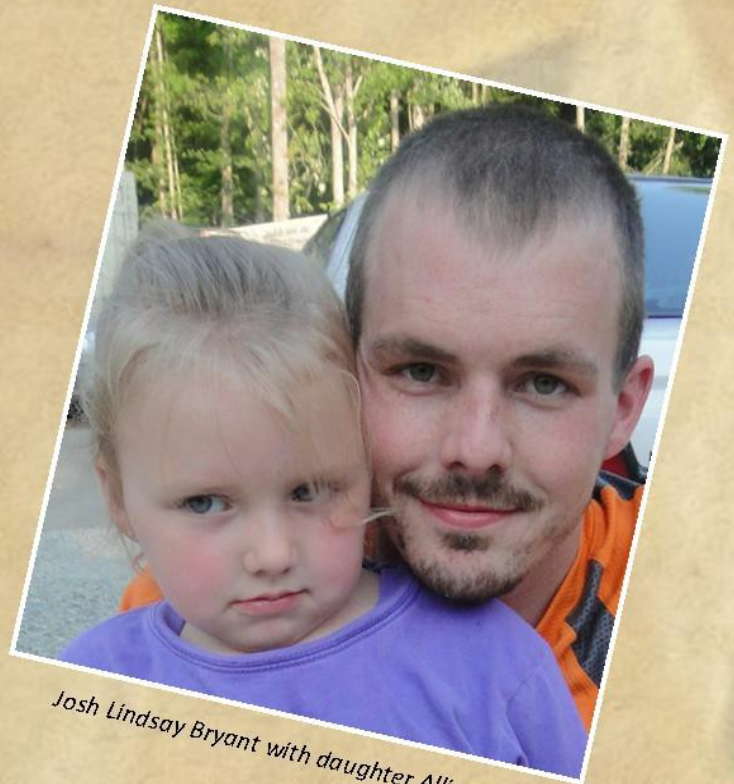


# 2011

Together, we raised the roof with eight families and helped build successful communities in Chatham County. Here's a summary of our work together in 2011. **Thank you for being a part of our success.**

- With you and partner families we constructed six new homes, four in Pittsboro and two in Siler City. In addition, two Habitat homes in Siler City were refurbished.
- We raised funds and friends with fabulous events including the Caterpillar Rodeo, house parties, Bouquet for Habitat wine tasting, Burrito Bash and Funky Fashion Show, Meet and Greet, and a Summer Solstice Garden Party.

- The 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Chatham 3Ring Cycle was a success with 230 cyclists riding along the beautiful roadways of Chatham County. The event raised \$9,500, more than double the proceeds of the previous year. Stay tuned for details on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Chatham 3Ring Cycle!
- A concerted effort to creatively get the word out about attaining homeownership through Chatham Habitat for Humanity resulted in 74 new applications to Chatham HFH this year. Seven applicants were selected to be Chatham Habitat partner families, and courageously started their journey to become homeowners.

- Personnel changes in construction, Home Stores, and resource development have resulted in both new and existing staff members learning exciting new roles and responsibilities. A capable, engaged staff is off and running as we work for a stronger Chatham County through successful homeownership.
- Young people formed a group called Chatham Habitat Active Teens (CHAT), contributed a record number of teen volunteer hours at Home Stores, and held a car wash fund raiser.

### The Year at a Glance

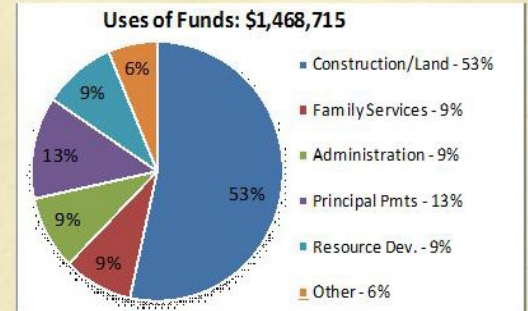
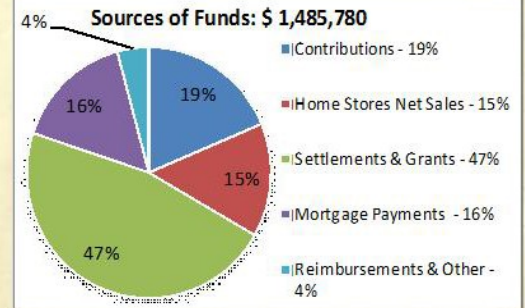
- 34,000** volunteer hours donated

- 1,672** Pick ups for Home Store donations
- 6** houses built and **2** homes refurbished
- 27** people moved into safe, decent homes

- 73** System Vision certified homes in 10 years

- For every house constructed, Chatham Habitat “tithes” \$2,000 to Habitat for Humanity International that is restricted for the construction of homes in developing countries. As a result, a total of 48 families have been sponsored internationally by Chatham HFH.
- Over a period of six weeks 259 Collegiate Challenge students from Pennsylvania, New York, and Washington DC volunteered with Chatham HFH during their Spring Break.

## 2010-2011 Financial Report



- Volunteer Hannah Popish led team members (staff, AmeriCorps members, and volunteers) from Chatham Habitat for Humanity on a Global Village Trip to Honduras where they labored to construct the foundation for a home ... one wheelbarrow-full of rock at a time.
- Profit from Home Stores operations increased by 27% over last year thanks to 12,500 volunteer hours, and generous donations of furniture, household items, hardware, and building materials.
- Children in the East Cornwallis Subdivision have consistently attended the after school tutoring program, enjoying a healthy snack and getting help on homework. A child who previously struggled now enjoys reading thanks to extra help he received at the after school program.
- CHFH was honored by Advanced Energy for building System Vision certified, energy efficient homes for 10 years. Correctly sized HVAC system, correct insulation installation, sealed crawl spaces, advanced framing and third party verification combine to achieve System Vision certification.
